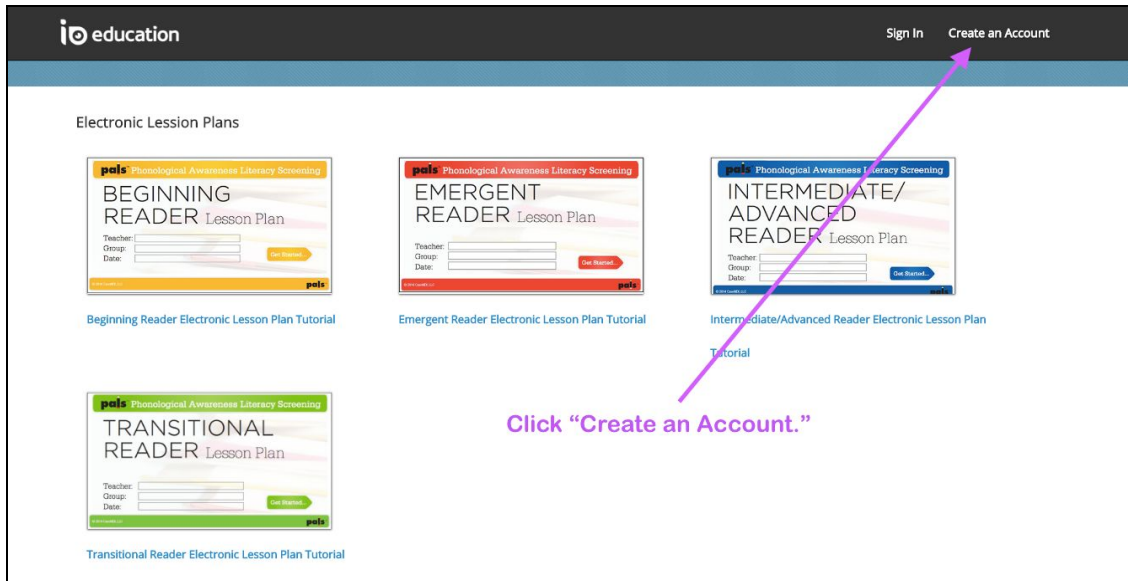


Instructions for Creating a PALS PD Account

If you are a PALS Premier school district, you have access to our online library of literacy courses and tutorials at PD.CaseNEX.com! Now defaults to palspd.ioeducation.com.

Step 1. Visit PD.CaseNEX.com or PALSpd.ioeducation.com and click on “Create an Account” in the upper righthand corner.



Step 2. Enter your email address in both the “Username” and “Email” fields. (If you already have a PALS Online account, please use the same email here.) Enter your first name and last name and your district’s registration code. Ask your PALS District Representative for the registration code that was emailed to her/him when your district’s account was reactivated for this school year.




